the University of Tampa, where she lectures and also assists in the development of the college's leadership programs.

lorio has held top executive leadership positions where she transformed bureaucracy, advanced unpopular change, and successfully navigated through tough financial times. First elected to public office at age 26, lorio was the youngest person ever to win a seat on the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners. In 1992 she was elected to the first of three terms as the county's Supervisor of Elections. In 1999 she served as the president of the State Association of Supervisors of Elections, and she served as its spokesperson during the highly publicized 2000 presidential election in Florida.

During her career she has served as a director and chairperson on numerous government, economic development, transportation, education, and community sector boards. She graduated from The American University in Washington, D.C. with a BS degree in Political Science, then earned a Master's degree in History from the University of South Florida. She has published articles on civil rights and political history and is regularly sourced on national media stories concerning government, leadership, and economic issues.

In 2003 Iorio was elected as mayor of the City of Tampa and re-elected in 2007 with a margin of 79 percent.

She has been featured in The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, and USA Today, as well as on national broadcast venues including CNN, FOX News, MSNBC's Hardball with Chris Matthews, and The Today Show.
