What does it mean to be a mentor? According to the CMCIS Mentor Program, it is "a developmental partnership through which one person shares knowledge, skills, information and perspective to foster the personal and professional growth of someone else. We all have a need for insight that is outside of our normal life and educational experience. The power of mentoring is that it creates a one-of-a-kind opportunity for collaboration, goal achievement and problem-solving."

Offering to be a mentor might not be as exciting, initially, as an iTunes or Amazon gift certificate but it certainly would be a wonderful and personal gift of help and experience for the younger person entering the workforce.
