membership, all of us have attained some advanced education, though not necessarily a college degree. Some of us have advanced degrees. Some have military training.

We have all achieved a level of independence in our professional pursuits. With freedom comes responsibility. While we may have control over our schedules and activities, we may be responsible for a particular production level. Some of us have achieved a level of management, with other personnel responsible to us. Many are in positions that require responsibility to ourselves, to our superiors, and from our staff. These are sort of like the three R's of professional development: responsible to ourselves (always), responsible to others (usually), and having others responsible to us (sometimes). Responsibility is another word for work!

A background check on any of us may turn up an odd job or two in our rich histories. I'll bet more than a few of us learned to work with others by taking that first job in the food service industry. Whether flipping burgers, waiting tables, or slinging cocktails, the experience is a piece in the rich mosaic that is your background. In looking back, I can't think of a better way to learn than to *do*. On-the-job training teaches more than the job itself —“How to Put Up with the Idiot in the Cubicle Next Door,” could be

the title of an early chapter in a professional life manual.

Learning by rejection is not something you can get from a textbook either. For example, seeing a senior citizen unhappily working in a low-wage position is likely a motivation to stay in school. Even “C” students can excel. Success is measured by the one achieving it. What gives us satisfaction is defined by each of us individually.

Working with a college student, part-time employee and having two children at that age serves as a daily reminder to me of how pivotal the first years away from home are in learning independence. Leaving our childhood homes behind and making our own ways in the world can take some time, and usually includes missteps that become lessons we try not to repeat. Funny stuff happens along the way—like leaving the grocery store after moving to my new home in Tampa, and feeling so grown up with several bags of groceries. In my own car, heading back to my own apartment, I realized I didn't know where I was. I broke into a sweat as did the meat and dairy items that were warming in the back seat while I drove in circles trying to find my way back to my apartment. I cursed myself while retracing my steps to the Winn-Dixie, then exited the parking lot in the other direction, and everything was familiar again. Whew!

Receiving a negative performance review, being fired, or just getting downsized are all lessons. Such experiences teach us to save for a rainy day. They teach us to pack a parachute, cultivate relationships, and keep our noses in the wind. Change happens, and sometimes it's not nice.

When NEW members speak about their backgrounds, I love to hear the stories. This is why our networking events away from scheduled luncheons are so important. There's simply not enough time to share the really good stories over lunch...they deserve to be savored over a glass of wine.
